7 LA COUNTY PUBLIC HOUSING RESOURCES

Public housing refers to specific housing developments owned and operated by the Los Angeles County Development Authority which leases units directly to families. Provides site based decent, safe, and sanitary rental housing for eligible low-income families, the elderly, and persons with disabilities. The LACDA currently manages public housing in: Marina Del Rey, Santa Clarita, unincorporated Los Angeles County, La Puente, Whittier, Long Beach, Lomita, Valencia, and La Crescenta.
